from the chair & general manager

This year has marked another good step forward for Tennis Canterbury as we worked through the second year of our three-year strategic plan. Building on last year's momentum, we have continued to strengthen the organisation, support our clubs, and expand opportunities for people across the region to get involved in tennis.

Participation and community engagement have again been highlights. Our tournaments and regional programmes continue to grow, with positive feedback from players and parents about the clarity of our development pathway. Indoor court bookings were also high, demonstrating the strong demand for year-round tennis.

Our clubs are at the heart of this success. Club membership has grown by 10% and they have reported strong uptake in junior and entry-level programmes, as well as increased interclub team numbers — clear signs of a tennis community driven by passionate volunteers and engaged members.

Supporting our clubs remained a central focus. We worked closely with clubs to navigate the requirements of the new Incorporated Societies Act, as well as Tennis New Zealand's regional governance changes. The governance changes, designed to improve how tennis is organised and delivered, have impacted the sub-associations of North Canterbury, Malvern, and Ellesmere, which will cease to exist in their previous forms. North Canterbury clubs will report directly to Tennis Canterbury, and Ellesmere and Malvern will merge to form a new entity representing the Selwyn area. As this new structure takes shape, we are committed to ensuring that the history and identity of these areas are honoured and remain part of Canterbury's tennis story. We acknowledge the considerable time and effort this has required and thank everyone who has contributed to this important work.

Progress has been made at Wilding Park - with upgrades to indoor courts and lighting, and Pacific Padel underway with the construction of padel courts and clubroom at the rear of the property. These developments will enhance Wilding Park's role as a dynamic regional hub for racquet sports and bring more people to the facility.

Financially, we are in a stable and more sustainable position. Following last year's surplus and the achievement of our reserves target, we now have the confidence to plan ahead, while continuing to carefully manage costs in what remains a challenging environment for many sporting bodies.

As always, much of what makes Tennis Canterbury successful is the commitment and energy of people behind the scenes. Our thanks go to the staff, Board (past and new members), and volunteers whose contributions are essential to our progress.

Tennis Canterbury is in a healthy and positive position — financially sound, strategically focused, and supported by an engaged, growing community. We are confident that we are continuing to build strong foundations for the future of tennis across our region.





Tom Batt - Men's Grand Prix

The Men's Grand Prix is awarded to the player with the most wins in Men's Premier Interclub. Tom won the Grand Prix in 2023 and has done it again in 2025 winning 15 of his 18 matches for Elmwood.

Tessa McCann - Women's Grand Prix

The Women's Grand Prix is awarded to the player who wins the most Women's Premier Interclub matches in a season. This year's winner is Tessa McCann who had an impressive 20 wins from 22 matches for Elmwood.

Adele Orangi – 100 Club

The 100 Club is a special part of Tennis Canterbury, celebrating the very few players who have won 100 Premier Interclub singles matches. In the past 100 years, more than 2,000 men and women have played Premier Interclub, but only 38 have reached 100 wins. Thirty-three years after her first win in 1991, Adele becomes just the 11th woman to reach this fantastic milestone.

Kerrie Ling - 100 Club

Kerrie won her first match in 1998 and her 100th in 2023. In 2025 Kerrie and her trophy are finally united - congratulations Kerrie on being just the 10th Woman to reach 100 wins in Premier Woman's Interclub.

Rebecca Helberg-Walker – Volunteer/ Administrator of the Year

Rebecca was Canterbury's local champion helping with club engagement for the 2024 Love Tennis Open Day. The results of her tireless work saw record attendances and has contributed to a 10% rise in club membership across the city.

Sally Moorfield - Club Coach of the Year

Coaches are the lifeblood of clubs, and their energy and enthusiasm is often the difference between a club thriving or just surviving. Over the past year, Sally has exemplified what it means to be a dedicated and innovative coach increasing membership, engagement and performance at Opawa Tennis Club.

Nic Jenkins - Performance Coach of the Year

Under Nic's leadership at Edgeware Tennis Club, performance players have gone from strength to strength, claiming five National titles over the past 12 months. He has been selected by Tennis NZ as the 13U Boys Coach for New Zealand for the last 2 years and led the 14U Canterbury team at the National Junior Teams Event.

Nic frequently travels to national and international events

to support his players, and their results demonstrate his ability to support and inspire.

Aliyah Daly - Junior Female Player of the Year

Ranked the number one 14 year old girl in New Zealand, Aliyah recently represented NZ in the Asia/Oceania Regional Championships where the team made the final eight. Aliyah won the 14U Nationals Girls Doubles and the 14U NZ Masters Girls Singles titles and was the number one player for both the Canterbury 17U team and the Bishopdale Premier Women's Interclub team.

Alvin Na - Junior Male Player of the Year

Alvin is the number one ranked 15-year-old boy in New Zealand. This year Alvin won the 14U Nationals Boys Singles and Doubles titles, the 14U Kiwi Indoor Nationals Boys Singles and Doubles titles and was runner up in the ITF J30 Auckland Boys Doubles. Alvin represented Canterbury in the 17U teams event and is currently training with the Tennis NZ Development programme.

Abby Mason - Player of the Year

Abby spent most of the year studying at Otago University but still found time to return to Christchurch for more than half of the Premier Women's competition where she went unbeaten in both singles and doubles, playing at number one for the title winning Elmwood team. Abby also won her third Canterbury Open Singles title and her third consecutive Canterbury Open Doubles title.

Opawa - Club of the Year

There has been a huge amount of great work done at clubs this year with Mt Pleasant, Sumner, Shirley, Halswell, Redcliffs, Beckenham, Burnside Park, Waimairi, South Brighton and Edgeware all seeing large growth in member numbers. This year, Opawa Tennis Club, has really flourished, seeing success in player development initiatives, competitive achievements, community engagement, and facility upgrades. Membership is up 54% and Opawa entered and won more Senior Interclub competitions than anyone can remember! Their Junior Interclub teams had a great year with two teams winning their competitions and five placing second

Lois Daniell - Ian Jones Memorial Award for Services to Tennis

This award honours a lifetime of service to tennis. Lois began her tennis administration in the 1970s in Hurunui, later becoming President of the Malvern Sub Association and serving on committees with Ian Jones, after whom this award is named. At Kaiapoi Tennis Club she is a daily presence, supporting coaching, players of all ages, and organising teams, competitions and tournaments. She consistently assists captains, parents and players on and off the court, and has now dedicated over 50 years to the sport. We are proud to recognise her outstanding contribution.

Statement of Accounting Policies

Tennis Canterbury Region Incorporated For the year ended 30 June 2025

Basis of Preparation

This performance report is prepared in accordance with the XRB's Tier 3 (NFP) Standard. The entity is eligible to apply these requirements because it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of less than \$5,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. This Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity is a going concern and will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Tennis Canterbury Region Incorporated is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Cash and short term deposits

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Revenue Recognition

Affiliation income

Affiliation Income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Other Member Related Revenue

Where members purchase specific services (for example, attendance at the coaching and development course), revenue is initially recorded as revenue in advance, and then recognised proportionally on the basis of the value of each session relative to the total value of the purchased services.

Other fees and subscriptions are recorded as revenue when cash is received.

Fundraising and Grants

Fundraising and Grant income is accounted for depending on whether or not it has a "use or return" condition attached. Where no use or return conditions are attached, the revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where income includes a use or return condition, it is initially recorded as a liability on receipt. The income is then subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donations

Donations are accounted for depending on whether they have been provided with a "use or return" condition attached or not. Where no use or return conditions are attached to the donation, revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where donations include a use or return condition, the donation is initially recorded as a liability on receipt. The donation is subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donated goods or services (other than donated assets) are not recognised.

Where significant donated assets are received with useful lives of 12 months or more, and the fair value of the asset is readily obtainable, the donation is recorded at the value of the asset obtained. Where the fair value of the asset is not readily obtainable, the donation is not recorded. Donated assets with useful lives less than 12 months are not recorded.

Event Income

Entrance & Participation fees for Representative programmes and events are recorded as revenue when the event takes place.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Other Income

All other income is accounted for on an accruals basis and accounted for in accordance with the substance of the transaction.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are shown at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis on all property, plant and equipment, at rates that will write off the cost of the assets to their estimated residual values over their useful lives. The depreciation rates and useful lives associated with major classes of assets have been estimated as follows:

Furniture and fittings	3 to 25 years
Plant & equipment	3 to 10 years
Indoor court surfaces	25 to 50 year
Outdoor court surfaces	5 to 50 years
Computer hardware	2 to 3 years
Office Equipment	33 years

Investments are valued at Current Market Value
